George Kourounis is a 21st century explorer/photographer/storm chaser/TV presenter who travels to the most dangerous, remote and inhospitable places on earth to document the extremes of nature ... tornadoes in Kansas, monster hurricanes in the Gulf of Mexico, forest fires in British Columbia, volcanic eruptions, avalanches, floods

Based in Toronto, his efforts to document nature's worst weather conditions have taken him all over the globe for over 20 years. He was named one of Canada's top 45 living explorers by Canadian Geographic Magazine, has given several international TEDx talks and has his own adventure TV program Angry Planet which has been broadcast in over 100 countries.
